HFFG in partnership with funding support from STOP TB Partnership Geneva is implementing the Challenge Facility for Civil Society Round 11 project titled, Strengthening Community Systems to Scale-up Community-led Response

Interventions for TB Control.

The project is aimed at reducing TB stigma, gender-based violence, and human rights abuse using innovative and evidence-based community-led interventions in the following high-burden districts.
